• Pictures with Santa are available daily at Peachtree Mall during mall hours through Dec. 24. They’re also available at Riverside, Fort Benning at 6 p.m. on Dec. 11.

• The Ludy Christmas Spectacular, 5784 Ironstone Drive, is a computerized light display with more than 70,000 lights. Corresponding music is broadcast on 90.1 FM. The show can be seen 6-10 p.m. Monday-Thursday and 6-10:30 p.m. Friday-Saturday, through Jan. 1. Donations for the Make-A-Wish Foundation are accepted. 706-888-1092.

• The Second Annual Broadway Holiday Lighting Event features snow flurries, the lighting of the Christmas tree and other downtown lights, live entertainment, holiday treats and a visit from Santa and his reindeer. The lighting takes place from 6 to 8 p.m. tonight at the 1100 block of Broadway. Bring a canned good to donate for the Columbus Business District’s Holiday Food Drive. 706-596-0111.

• CSU’s International House is hosting the Third Annual Christmas Flavors from Around the World from 6:30 to 8 p.m. tonight. For \$5, enjoy homemade holiday dishes from Germany, Mexico, Japan, India and Australia. 706-507-8852.

• Take a step back in time at the National Civil War Naval Museum at Port Columbus. The museum hosts a Victorian Christmas from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. The museum will be decorated for the holidays in mid-19th century Victorian style. There will be a re-creation of a Holiday Officer’s Dinner and Thomas Nast’s version of Santa Claus will be available for professional pictures. ÿ The Annual Tower Lighting at Fort Benning's Eubanks Field will be 3:30 p.m. Dec. 12. Free family activities and music will lead up to Santa's jump onto the field (weather permitting) at 5 p.m. Vendors, displays and a Stryker will be on hand while Santa visits with the children. 706-545-3512.

ÿ George T. Bagby State Park and Lodge hosts Breakfast with Santa on Dec. 13 from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. A breakfast buffet will be set up in the Coleman Conference Center and photos of Santa with children will be available.
